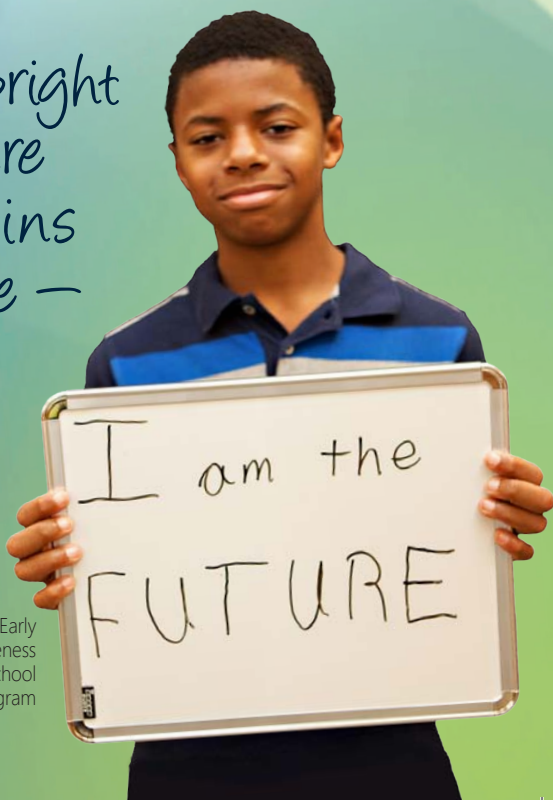


College Changes Everything!
